The winner of the first prize, didn't want publicity but it has made a huge difference to their lives.

Golf Day

There were 22 teams and approximately £10,000 was made, what a fantastic achievement, well done to all who helped. There were some very happy and tired children at the end of the party, it was a great start to Christmas. Variety at Work

Final figures for the year - 547 families with 898 children amounting to £121,289

Chris Robin and they have to make a lot of difficult decisions throughout the year, it was decided not to supply white goods or large items as it was thought necessary that we should continue to support the disadvantaged families with food, clothing and primary school uniforms and shoes. This year the requests for school uniforms increased. I have had several conversations with the Minister of Education in relation to the costs of the uniforms as they are causing a lot of concern for many families. Again Variety has had a lot of media attention over this on the radio, tv and in the JEP, which has helped to raise the profile of the charity. The latest news on this is that it is being taken seriously and being looked at for 2024. Variety also provided many items to Womens Refuge who we work very closely with.



Christmas Presents

This year Variety has given out nearly 400 presents to many primary schools who have children who get very little and we try to make their Christmas special, this is the largest delivery to date. Thanks to Andrew Videgrain who has not only overseen this initiative but his son Jacob and his friend Steve Ashton have raised over £2,500 by running in Jersey's Marathon. Also thanks to Brian Godfray who raised money for Variety by completing the gruelling 100km Petra Walk. Donations have also been gratefully received from Mitchell's Building Contractors and to those who took part in the Golf Day. Also thanks for the fantastic contribution of toys from Channel 103's Toy and Gift Appeal supported by Ravenscroft and Apex for their wonderful donation of toys from all the staff.

The McGugan Family Trust was formed in May 2019 in memory of the late Arthur McGugan and his family kindly gifted the meadow to the Trust. It was an emotional day but so special. Variety Sailing Trust

Paul Pinel is the Chairman for this which gives so many sailing opportunities to local children and young people in Jersey. Each year, hundreds are able to enjoy and benefit from the experience of going afloat under sail, all free of charge. The 38 foot catamaran called "The Vernon Lilford Spirit of Variety" which was sponsored by the late Lord Lilford's estate, was built in Poland in 2007 and initially managed by Education within the Trust. The Variety Sailing Trust, incorporated 30 years ago in 1993, now works in partnership with Praxis who provide sponsorship for the operating costs. Variety is always willing to support this fantastic catamaran in any way, as it so important for so many. A big thank you to Paul for all the time and effort he puts into this, making it more productive and the success it is today.



Simply Christmas

Again this year, Variety was chosen as the charity for this event which ran for 3 weeks, from the end of November. Paul Pinel took over the organisation of this where the raffle consisted of 3 hampers filled with donated items from all the stallholders with all the proceeds coming to Variety.
